Message from the Principal

Dear Viking F-A-M-I-L-Y (Students, Parents & Staffulty):

We're 4 weeks into the school year and coming back faster, performing higher, and getting stronger, together, akin to the Olympic motto I referenced in our summer edition of *The Lesher Difference* - Citius, Altius, Fortius, Communiter. Our 782 students and 80 staff are excited to be accelerating learning opportunities and outcomes for our students. I enjoyed meeting and chatting with many of you at Back-to-School Night on the thawed tundra of Viking Stadium (it will be frozen soon enough). In-person learning is going great. We are getting our clubs and activities up and running, thanks to our dedicated staff willing to sponsor after-school opportunities. Sports are going strong again with over 230 student-athletes competing – boys and girls cross country (105), boys and girls football (64), boys and girls tennis (35), and girls volleyball (32). We also received word a couple weeks ago that our music programs will be allowed to host in-person concerts with real audiences this fall!

Our students, staff and visitors are complying well with the district mask mandate. With the rest of society wide open we have had some COVID cases come into the building, which we spend considerable time contact tracing (less than 3 feet from the case in routine classroom settings, less than 6 feet from the case in higher risk settings, and anyone who had direct physical contact with the case) and documenting that for the Larimer County Dept. of Health and Environment (LCDHE). We've had 2 confirmed staff cases and 16 confirmed student cases since the first day of school, all reporting minor common cold or flu-like symptoms for a few days. Since 5 positive cases in a cohort group, i.e., a grade level of 270 or so students, within 2 weeks qualifies as an "outbreak" at Lesher, there are only 2 ways to avoid quarantine:

- 1) You have tested positive for COVID within the past 90 days.
- 2) You have completed the full series of an FDA-authorized COVID vaccine and 14 days have passed since your final vaccination and exposure to someone who has COVID.

It's important to note a person can get out of a close contact quarantine early if no symptoms have developed and the person has a negative COVID test (molecular or antigen) within 2 days of ending quarantine (day 8 instead of 10), and the test is taken no sooner than 5 days after the person was a close contact to the person with COVID. As always, please keep your child(ren) home if they have any symptoms. Thank you, parents and guardians for your continued support keeping the virus off The Viking Ship!

Lastly, parent drivers, we prefer you use the parent drop off and pick up area along Ellis St. on the east side of our building. We have a crossing guard at the Ellis St. drop off/pick up and you may use the church parking lot to drop off/pick up, or exit. Please PULL FORWARD, yield to the buses, obey traffic signs and speed limits, DO NOT block crosswalks or driveways, make U-turns, or leave a vehicle unattended in a handicapped space. Our 4 buses drop off and pick up on Stover St. (West) and Lake St. (North) and we prefer to keep parent traffic away from the buses as much as possible.

JUST ANNOUNCED!


Performances are returning to Lesher, which means it's time to audition for our 8th Grade Musical - SEUSSICAL!














Notes from the Music Department, continued...



Lesher Cross Country Running Teams Take First/Second Place!

Lesher Cross Country Runners had their second race of the season on Thursday, 9/2 and they CRUSHED IT! Get this, they competed against ALL 9 SCHOOLS IN FORT COLLINS and the boys team WON and the girls team took SECOND.

First off, the boys Varsity team beat every other school in Fort Collins for the second race in a row. Ian Tiley was the first Lesher runner to finish and he ran the 2-mile race in just over 12 minutes, finishing second place out of every middle schooler in Fort Collins! Oliver Singleton finished a few seconds after Ian in 4th place! Jake Kirby finished in 6th place a few seconds later, and Tobin Rapley, Max Abernathy, and Abe Cooley were close behind.

In the girls' Varsity race, Gracyn Redmond was the first Lesher runner to cross the finish line in 13 ½ minutes. She ended up in 5th place out of every middle school runner in Fort Collins. Ayslee Stone was the next Lesher runner to finish in 7th place, then Juliet Koenig in 8th place, Kendall Montross in 10th place, followed by Aryana Arabi! The girls team ended up second place out of all the middle schools in Fort Collins, only 2 points behind Kinard.



The boys and girls JV teams both finished in 2^{nd} place! Lesher had another 90 runners finish the race, many in record time. 39 runners had a personal best for the season. Great job to all Lesher Cross Country runners! Keep it up!





On another note, every week, Cross Country coaches select 1 or 2 CHAMP (CHaracter in Athletics Make it a Priority) Athletes of the Week. We call these our "Coach Awards" because this award can go to anyone on the team, regardless of how fast they run a race, what grade they are in, or if they are male or female. This award goes to runners who go above and beyond to demonstrate leadership, integrity, and outstanding character before, during and after practice. These athletes not only take care of their needs, but they bring everyone up by setting a positive example every day and they make us all better as a result. Trauma-Informed Parenting Class

This class takes a unique, relationship-based approach to parenting traumatized children and those with attachment challenges. This approach provides a trauma-informed explanation of "acting out" behaviors. Caregivers will learn how children escalate through behaviors, as well as how to respond to help their children during these times. When children and caregivers expand their ability to emotionally tolerate stressful situations, behavior naturally improves. The class is appropriate for biological parents, adoptive parents, foster parents, and kinship-care providers.

Some Program Topics

- Emotional regulation and dysregulation
 - Window of stress tolerance
 - Trauma and memory
- Acting out behaviors, i.e. lying, stealing, aggression, etc.
 - Signs and stages of verbal and behavioral escalation
 - Caregiver responses to decrease escalation
 - Setting appropriate and enforceable limits

In the interest of student, parent, & staff safety:

Drivers

- Slow down
- Drop-off/pick-up students at designated times & places
- PULL FORWARD in the drop-off/pick-up area
- Yield to pedestrians & crossing guards in crosswalks
- DO NOT BLOCK the roadway, bicycle lanes, handicap spaces, bus entrances, or driveways
- NO parking, stopping, or standing at RED CURBS
- DO NOT make u-turns on streets around the school

Bicyclists/Skateboarders

- Bicycles should use bicycle lanes & obey traffic laws
- Dismount your bicycle/ skateboard on the sidewalk in front of the school & walk
- Secure your bicycle/skateboard on the racks at the north side of the school

Pedestrians

- Use crosswalks
- Make eye contact with drivers prior to crossing
