#### **Health Office Information**

Hello Lesher Families! Please remember, if you have not turned in an updated shot record for your student's 6<sup>th</sup> grade TDaP booster or any other recently received vaccinations, please provide the most up-todate shot record you have to the Lesher Health Office. THANK YOU!!

Please remember that students CANNOT Self-Carry their own medications without a MD order. The ONLY medications that MS students are allowed to Self-Carry are antihistamines (i.e. Benadryl, Zyrtec), EpiPens/AuviQs, and albuterol inhalers. Even cough drops are not allowed to be Self-Carried! We are happy to keep all other meds (including cough drops!) in the Health Office once we have the required MD orders/forms. ## **Appropriate Dress**

Responsibility for the dress and appearance of students generally rests with the individual students and their parents. Student appearance should reflect pride in themselves when attending school and school-sponsored events. As stated in district policy, students must wear: a shirt (with fabric in the front, back, and on the sides underneath the arms, midriff should not show); pants or the equivalent (e.g. a skirt, sweatpants, leggings, a dress, or shorts); and shoes (e.g. sandals, boots, or athletic shoes).

- Clothing choices need to allow for the participation in all school related activities (e.g. flip flops, Crocs, and sandals are okay for school, but students should bring athletic shoes when they participate in P.E. and health classes due to the activity level).
- Students who wear shirts with inappropriate statements or pictures that cause or have the potential to cause disruption to the learning of others will be asked to wear the shirt inside out or will be provided with another shirt if one is available. They may also call home and ask their parents to bring a different shirt or top.
- Hats or hoods that do not obscure a student's face or ears are permitted. We need to be able to see your eyes and ears.

This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. #### Traffic Safety at Lesher Middle School

1400 Stover St. | Fort Collins

To help streamline drop-off and pick-up, please adhere to Lesher's Traffic Safety. The area directly in front of the main entrance is designated to busses only. The main entrance and cafeteria entrance are the only entry points to the building; however, during school hours, you must come through the front office.



- Slow down
- PULLFORWARD in the drop-off/pick-up area
- Yield to pedestrians & crossing guards in crosswalks
- DO NOT BLOCK the roadway, bicycle lanes, handicap spaces, bus entrances, or driveways
- NO parking, stopping, or standing at REDCURBS
- Bicycles should use bicycle lanes & obey traffic laws
- Dismount your bicycle/ skateboard on the sidewalk in front of the school & walk
- Secure your bicycle/skateboard on the racks at the north side of the school
- Use crosswalks
- Make eye contact with drivers prior to crossing
